Message from the Interim Chief Executive Officer

Advocating for better transport

Sunshine Coast workers currently face average rail speeds of 56km/hr from Nambour to Brisbane – this is slower than all other South-East Queensland (SEQ) rail trips, which have average travel speeds of 60km/hr. In addition, the Sunshine Coast is the only significant urban area (SUA) in Australia which doesn't have CBD passenger rail connection to a capital city, from the new Maroochydore City Centre to Brisbane.

RDA Sunshine Coast is heartened by the Federal Government funded business case progressing for North Coast Connect. North Coast Connect is the only faster-rail project funded in Queensland, with the business case due for completion in March 2019.

The project would dramatically reduce Coast workers' commute times – a much-needed improvement to our way of life. It is aimed at delivering 160km/h faster rail to better



connect Brisbane, Moreton Bay and the Sunshine Coast. This would cut the rail travel time between Brisbane to Nambour, for example, by 45-50 minutes to under one hour.

When operational, North Coast Connect will service 1.5 million commuters – providing more sustainable and safer public transport between Brisbane and the Sunshine Coast, plus reducing commuter pressure on the congested Bruce Highway, where there are regular accidents, stoppages and delays. Of course, SEQ would also greatly benefit from improved transport infrastructure in light of the Council of Mayors (SEQ) currently conducting a feasibility study into a potential 2032 Olympic Games bid for the region.

Eight SEQ councils are currently funding and participating in an Olympic feasibility study which will investigate whether a regional 2032 Olympic Games bid could be a catalyst for infrastructure and transport investment, boost the economy and raise the region's international profile. This transport and feasibility study is due to be completed by year's end. In other heartening news, a SEQ Olympic Games bid has already received in-principle support from the Australian Olympic Committee.




This latest funding round will focus on regional tourism, following six Sunshine Coast projects receiving a \$3,168,43 cash injection under round two of the BBRF.
