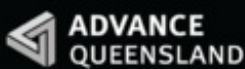

Gambling Community Benefit Fund now open for applications

Local not-for-profit groups can apply for grants from \$500 to \$35,000 through the Gambling Community Benefit Fund (GCBF.)

Grant round 102 is now open and will close on August 31, 2019.

This fund - now in its 25th anniversary year - is Queensland's largest one-off community grants program, distributing approximately \$57 million per year.

The fund allocates grants to not-for-profit community groups, to enhance their capacity to provide services, leisure activities and opportunities for Queensland communities.
